"Joy in the Journey"

Luke 10:1-22

Introduction: "Are you on a Griswold journey?"

What brings joy in our journey?

1. \_\_\_\_\_ by Jesus.

*"After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go." v.1*

- To go with \_\_\_\_\_.

2. A Godly, God-sized task.

*He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." v.2*

*"He who listens to you listens to me; he who rejects you rejects me; but he who rejects me rejects him who sent me." v.16*

3. Be \_\_\_\_\_ with what you can and cannot do.

*"But when you enter a town and are not welcomed, go into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that sticks to our feet we wipe off against you. Yet be sure of this: The kingdom of God is near.'" v.10-11*

*"However, do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven." v.20*

*At that time Jesus, full of joy through the Holy Spirit, said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. Yes, Father, for this was your good pleasure." v.21*
