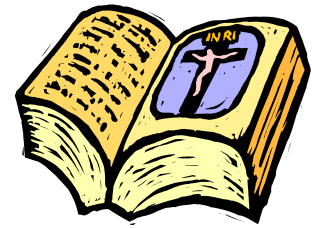

<u>Quiz Date</u>	<u>Passage</u>
Thursday Aug. 31, 2006	(Romans 5:8) But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 10:9) That if you confess with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord,” and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.
Thursday, Sept. 7, 2006	(Hebrews 4:12) For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.
Thursday, Sept. 14, 2006	(Colossians 4:5-6) Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone. (Romans 10:17) Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ.
Thursday, Sept. 21, 2006	(II Timothy 1:7-8) For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline. So do not be ashamed to testify about our Lord, or ashamed of me his prisoner. But join with me in suffering for the gospel, by the power of God. . . .”
Thursday, Sept. 28, 2006	(II Timothy 3:16-17) All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.
Thursday, Oct. 5, 2006	(II Corinthians 5:20-21) We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ’s behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
Thursday, Oct. 12, 2006	(I Peter 5:8-10) Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that your brothers throughout the world are undergoing the same kind of sufferings. And the God of grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ . . . will make you strong, firm, and steadfast.
Thursday, Oct. 19, 2006	(I John 1:8-9) “If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, He who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”

Thursday, Oct. 26, 2006	(Deuteronomy 6:5) "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." (Matthew 18:20) "For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them." (Ephesians 2:10) "For we are God's workmanship created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."
Wednesday Nov. 15, 2006	(Ephesians 4:32) "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as Christ God forgave you." (James 5:16) "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective."
Thursday Nov. 30, 2006	(Ephesians 3:16-17) "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith." (Psalm 46:10) "Be still and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth."
Thursday, Dec. 7, 2006	(James 1:2-3) "Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance." (I Peter 4:10) "Each one of you should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms."
Thursday, Dec. 14, 2006	(Matthew 19:26) "Jesus looked at them and said, 'With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.'" (2 Peter 3:9) "The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."
Thursday, Dec. 20, 2006	(Psalm 145:3) "Great is the Lord and most worthy of praise; his greatness no one can fathom." (Romans 12:1) "Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual act of worship."

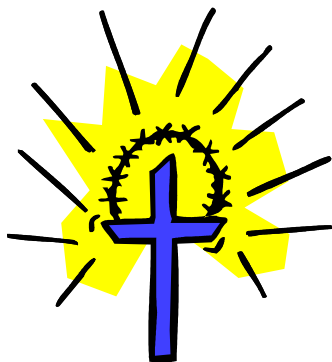

<u>Quiz Date</u>	<u>Passage</u>
Thursday, Jan. 11, 2007	(John 13:34-35) A new command I give you: Love on another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another. (I Thessalonians 5:21-22) Test everything. Hold on to the good. Avoid every kind of evil.
Thursday, Jan. 18, 2007	(Ephesians 6:12-13) For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore, take up the full armor of God, that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm.
Thursday, Jan. 25, 2007	(Hebrews 11:1) Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see. (I Peter 3:15) But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect.
Thursday, Feb. 1, 2007	(I Timothy 6:12, 15b-16) Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses. . . . God is the blessed and only Ruler, the King of kings and Lord of lords, who alone is immortal and who lives in unapproachable light, whom no one has seen or can see. To him be honor and might forever.

Thursday, Feb. 14, 2007	(Titus 3:5) He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. (Luke 21:14-15) But make up your mind not to worry beforehand how you will defend yourselves. For I will give you words and wisdom that none of your adversaries will be able to resist or contradict.
Thursday, Feb. 28, 2007	(John 14:26-27) But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

<u>Quiz Date</u>	<u>Passage</u>
Thursday Mar. 15, 2007	(John 10:10) “The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.” (II Corinthians 5:15) “And He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.”
Thursday Mar. 22, 2007	(Luke 12:22-24) “Then Jesus said to His disciples, ‘Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat; or about your body, what you will wear. Life is more than food, and the body more than clothes. Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap, they have no storeroom or barn, yet God feeds them. And how much more valuable you are than the birds!’”
Thursday Apr. 5, 2007	(Jeremiah 1:5a, 7-8) “‘Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart. . . Do not say, ‘I am only a youth.’ You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you,’ declares the Lord.”
Thursday Apr. 12, 2007	(Romans 6:23) “For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.”
Thursday Apr. 19, 2007	(I Thessalonians 4:13-14) “Brothers, we do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in Him.”
Thursday Apr. 26, 2007	(I Timothy 4:4-5) “For everything God created is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving, because it is consecrated by the word of God and prayer.” (Acts 2:38) “Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.”
Thursday May 3, 2007	(Acts 5:29-32) “We must obey God rather than men! The God of our fathers raised Jesus from the dead—whom you had killed by hanging him on the tree. God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might give repentance and forgiveness of sins to His people. We are witnesses of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey Him.”
Thursday May 10, 2007	(Romans 8:31b, 38-39) “If God is for us, who can be against us? For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”
Thursday May 17, 2007	(II Timothy 4:7-8) “I have fought the good fight, I have finished race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for His appearing.”
